Church Autopsy Part 4:

members of this church have a more important goal to acThis week we will finish looking at "Autopsy of a Deceased Church." There are many other important topics that the book covers, but for now let's briefly consider just one more: "purpose."

There is a definite contrast between a church driven by preferences (see chapter 7) and one driven by purpose (see chapter 10). When a church is driven by preferences, the questions that are asked are always related to "What do the people want." (or even, "What do I want?). When a church is driven by a purpose, the questions asked are always, "What will help us accomplish our purpose?"

Now, I will say right at the outset that if your purpose is not a God-given, biblical one, you cannot succeed as a church. Some people think the purpose of the church is to do whatever the lost people outside of the church want. This is worse than a preference driven church, because it is really another form of a preference driven church where the actual members don't even get a say. These churches are often called "seeker sensitive," but really they are "seeker driven." They often seek to become entertaining, complete with secular rock songs in the church service, simply to attract people to come to the church. Even when many people do come, this is not a healthy church.

The church worship service is for believers. The design of the church worship service should often look to the preferences of the believers who come to worship there. However, the church is much more than the Sunday morning worship service. The church exists to make disciples and to teach others to obey everything Jesus commanded. A large component is to "Go" which ;means to reach those outside the church. When a church has an outward focus and is driven by a godly purpose, it will rarely spend much energy fighting over worship service preferences, the complish.
