Sermon Topic and Scripture

“Alive Again”

Genesis 45: 25-28

Discipleship

We have looked at some similarities between Joseph and Jesus in our Sunday morning series on Genesis the last few weeks. These similarities show us that the Joseph story fits a pattern, and the pattern tells us that God's plan to send Jesus was already in place during the events of Jesus. Joseph's life really serves as a prophecy about the life of Jesus. Here is a list of some of the similarities between the two:

Joseph was his father's favorite son, Jesus was God's beloved and “one and only” son.

Joseph was born after God miraculously opened Rachel's womb. Jesus was born of a virgin in a miraculous birth.

Joseph went from Canaan to Egypt and returned to Canaan (he was buried there). Jesus went to Egypt as a baby and returned.

Joseph was a shepherd for his father's sheep. Jesus is the Good Shepherd of his Father's sheep.

Joseph was sent to his brothers (the Jews at that time) by his father. Jesus was sent to the Jewish people by the Father.

Joseph's brothers were jealous of him. The Jewish leaders were jealous of Jesus because the people followed him.

Joseph was betrayed by his brothers and sold for twenty pieces of silver. Jesus was betrayed by one close to him and sold for thirty pieces of silver. (Both were the price for a slave at the time).

Joseph and Jesus were falsely accused of crimes they did not commit.

Two men were imprisoned with Joseph, one was restored, the other executed. Two criminals were crucified with Jesus, one was saved and the other was not. Joseph went from prison (the “pit”) to the palace next to Pharaoh. Jesus went from the grave to heaven with the father.

All bowed to Joseph. Every knee will bow to Jesus
