Sermon: "The Renewal" Scripture: Matthew 19:27-30

Discipleship

Pentecost is this Sunday. We will celebrate with a special time of fellowship in the annex. Why celebrate Pentecost? I will be sharing more on Sunday night, but for now I will introduce some of the reasons for this holiday.

As Christians, we associate Pentecost with the coming of the Holy Spirit as recorded in Acts 2. Just as we celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas and His death and resurrection at Easter, the coming of the Holy Spirit was a major event worthy of our annual ob-

But Pentecost was already a long observed traditional holiday for God's people for more than a thousand years before the events of Acts 2. The Jewish people, including Jesus and the disciples, recognized it as the day that God gave the law to Moses on Mount Sinai. The Israelites blew the shofar (trumpet) on the morning of Pentecost as a (trumpet) on the morning of Pentecost as a reminder of the thundering sound when God descended on Mount Sinai.

Today, Jewish people celebrate with food and special religious services. Sweets and dairy products are the traditional foods. Items like blintzes and cheesecake are some of the most popular. "Mount Sinai cake" is another popular item that we will have at church Sunday night. I would like to invite you to bring a sweet or dairy dish of your own to share. Recipes for special dishes are available in the office if you would like to try something new. We will have a brief business conference, I will share about the holiday, and then we will have time to eat and fellowship together.
