Sermon "The Vineyard" Scripture "Matthew 21:33-46

Discipleship

Did the law "die?"

There is much confusion among Christians about what to make of the commands in the Old Testament. Do we need to keep all the commandments related to the Sabbath Day, festivals, and dietary commands? If not, why not?

Most of us would never consider following these laws. And yet, Jesus said, "Anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven." (Matt. 5:10) The law itself says that the Sabbath will be a sign for the Israelites "forever." (Exodus 31:17)

Many Christians believe that since we have "died to the law" (Romans 7:4) we no longer need to consider these commands but only the commands found in the New Testament. The trouble is that Jesus taught his followers to obey the law, and taught them to teach all nations to "obey everything I have commanded you." (Matt. 28:20) While we have "died to the law," nothing in the Bible indicates that the law has died.

Paul defines what it means to die to the law in Romans 6-8. Before we were saved through faith, the law was a burden to us because we couldn't follow it. Pursuing righteousness by keeping the commandments did not work but left us condemned. But those who pursue righteousness through faith (as the Old Testament itself teaches) have righteousness already and the gift of the Spirit. The law then becomes a guide to live in a way that brings peace and joy as we seek to follow God's will.

There are many commands in the Old Testament that we should follow, whether or not they are repeated in the New Testament. The law has not died, only our position as slaves to the condemnation it brings. However, many commands are specifically given to the Israelites. God does not command all nations to follow them the same way. This includes many commands about the Sabbath and dietary restrictions. Context should always guide us in interpreting the Bible.
