Commandments for Social Media (part 2):

The following is a list of biblical commands that I have applied to social media. I hope they are helpful in guiding you to a God glorifying use of social media.

- 1. Love God Supremely. As in every area of life, our goal in how to use social media should be to glorify God. This does not mean that every post must be religious. It means that the sum total of your posts should display a love for God and others. Comments should be characterized by grace and truth. If you honestly evaluate your comments and realize that some or much of what you post is not helpful for glorifying God, then make some changes. Ask, "How can my posts bring glory to God in the coming week?"
- 2. Thou shalt love your neighbor as Your self. If you are posting something personal, ask, "What would I think if someone posted something like this about me?" Debates can turn negative and personal very quickly on social media. Does it help? Does it change any minds? Of course not. It is usually more important to be loving than right.

3. Thou Shalt Not Gossip Online.

Gossip occurs when you share information about someone that they would not want you to share with others. Sometimes the information that is shared is incorrect or only part of the story. Even when it is truthful it is usually none of our business. We all have done things we want to keep private. Information shared online can travel even further

and faster that gossip shared in person. Love others by treating them as you would want to be treated when it comes to gossip.

4. Thou shalt Be Truthful:

We live in a fake news era. Many posts go around that are intentionally misleading. Others slant a story unfairly by leaving out key information or context. Do not repost news stories if you don't have a reason to trust the source or haven't verified it. Christians lose credibility when they post stories that others know are false. Legitimate news organizations at the national and local level can also spread gossip that is biased or only part of the story.
