Discipleship 2019 Sermon: Matthew 26:1-16 "They Schemed" Sunday PM: The Bible and Government <u>New Sunday night series</u>: The Bible and Government

Discipleship:

News programs frequently feature debates about what the Bible says about political issues. Voices from the right and left argue that the Bible supports their positions on immigration, taxes, marriage, and more. Often people on opposite sides of a position will both cite Bible verses to support their position.

What's really going on here? Should we study the Bible to determine our political positions? Do our political positions matter to Jesus? Is one side "right" about what the Bible teaches on political issues?

Our new Sunday night series will address these questions. We will examine deeper issues than what the Bible says about politics. I will teach this series from the perspective that the lordship of Jesus does extend to all of life, including how we vote. Differences of opinion on key Bible passages have to do with the method of biblical interpretation. Therefore, political issues can help us think through a proper method for studying the Bible. The goal of this series will be to help you understand the Bible better when it comes to every issue in life.
