Sermon: Genesis 3:1-15
“Did God Really Say?”

Discipleship:
Pastor David’s book, “Prosperous and Successful, Pursuing God’s Plan for Your Life,” will be available soon. Copies will be available in the church office for \$15 and at online bookstores. Here is an excerpt:

Jesus referred to the Bible specifically as “the Word of God” at different times in his ministry. For example, in Mark 7:10, Jesus quoted one of the Ten Commandments to the religious leaders: “For Moses said, ‘Honor your father and mother.’” Jesus pointed out that certain traditions they had created were contrary to God’s command. He explained this by stating, “Thus you nullify the word of God by your tradition” (Mark 7:10–13). Jesus called the Bible the Word of God and also cited it as an authority over human tradition.

For Jesus, identifying the Bible as the Word of God means that whatever it commands or promises is authoritative and trustworthy. When Jesus faced temptation in the wilderness, he quoted repeatedly from the Bible, introducing each passage with the phrase, “It is written” (Luke 4:4, 8, 12). Jesus assumed that if it is written in the Bible, then no other supporting argument is necessary, only obedience. He was saying that you can trust its words and must do what it says.

Think of Jesus as the ultimate witness, with the Bible on trial. He is the defense team’s star witness. He was actually present when the Bible was written. He can vouch for the Bible’s authenticity. You do not need to believe that the Bible is God’s Word to see the historical evidence that Jesus made these claims and supported them. I believe any reasonable jury would be persuaded by the evidence, and I hope that you will be as well. God invites you to look at the evidence, even if you begin with a fair amount of skepticism, because he wants you to know the truth.

In this book, I intend to accomplish two objectives. I want to help grow your confidence that the Bible is true and that it is the ultimate resource for life. I will begin in chapter 1 by clarifying what the Bible means by “success.” What exactly is the Bible promising in Joshua 1:8 that I am asking you to believe? Indeed, not only to believe, but on which to place all your

hope for a truly successful life. Chapter 2 will focus specifically on why you can trust that this promise is true. In subsequent chapters, I will explain how we know the Bible is true and show you how to use it effectively to obtain the Joshua 1:8 promise in your life.
