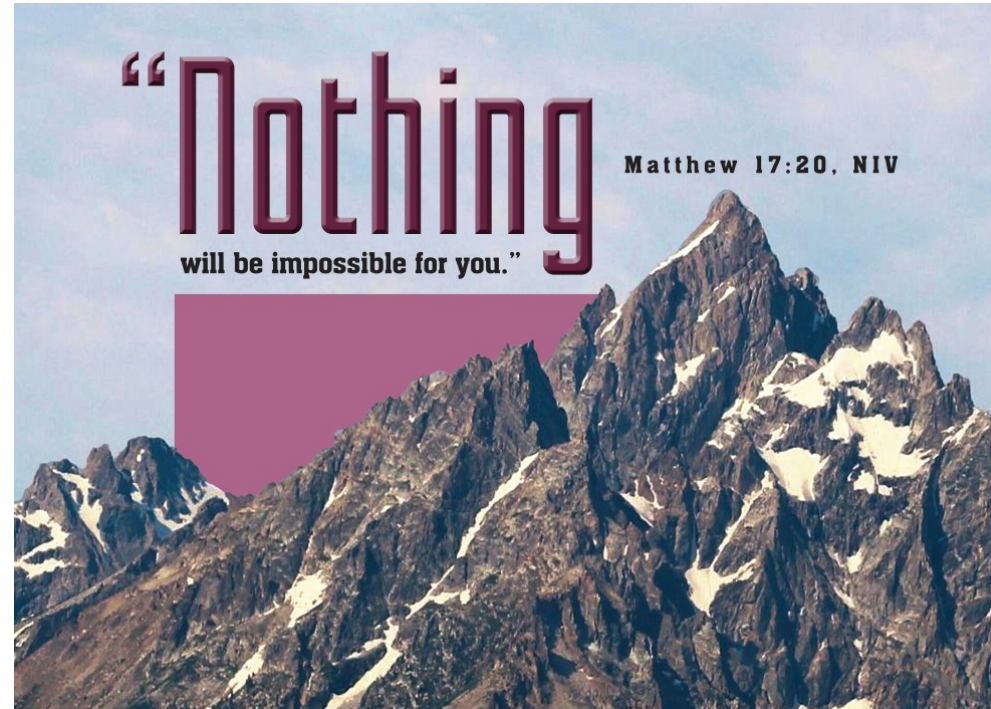

Sermon: Leviticus 1:3-9

“Pleasing to the LORD”

Torah Portion: Leviticus 1-5

Discipleship:

It was so exciting to see our church come together to pray and worship in the parking lot this past Sunday. Everyone showed great flexibility and a spirit to do whatever it takes to make the most of our current circumstances. I pray that we will seek to make the most of this time to fully engage with God in worship and to reach out to others.

When we first started planning our Sunday service, I didn’t know if we would have 50 people in church on Sunday (or if we would even have church!). However, through the drive-in church service, we had 39 vehicles (we do not have a count of people, but most vehicles had at least two people). Over 850 viewed at least a small part of our online service! God can work in our church in the midst of all the challenges we are facing. Let’s keep working together to make this happen.

Here’s what you can do to help:

1. Stay informed. Our plans may need to change quickly. Our newsletter may already be behind by the time Sunday rolls around. The best way to stay informed is to check the website, fairfaxfbc.org, or the Facebook site, “First Baptist Church, Fairfax, SC”
2. Let your friends know about our church services online and the drive-in services. You may know someone whose church is

cancelled and would like to participate in one of our services. Or, there may be others who are interested in seeing what we are doing as a church in a time like this. Easter is also right around the corner, which is normally a great time to invite people to church.

3. Personally ask God what he wants you to learn from this experience. I do not believe that all this is happening for no reason. God is up to something. We cannot simply hope for it to pass by quickly. Instead, we must actively seek to obtain all God has in store for us in the midst of the challenges.

4. Let’s keep in touch with others and pray for one another through the telephone.
