

.Sermon: Numbers 6 1-8 "Nazirite"

Torah Portion: Numbers 4:21-7:89

Discipleship: "Confession"

From Shadows of the Messiah

In the Bible, a person confesses his sin before God, as David said, "Against You, You only. I have sinned and done what is evil in Your sight. (Psalm 51:6) When we sin against others, we must apologize and make amends with the person against whom we have sinned. Similarly, the Master teaches that we must forgive those who have sinned against us. He says, "If you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions" (Matthew 6:15).

Sin is transgression of the Torah. To sin is human: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23); "If we say that we have not sinned we make Him a liar and His word is not in us." (1John 1:10) When we sin, the Torah says, we are to confess that sin. One who sins and does not confess his sin before God and renounce it commits a second sin.

The flesh resists confessing sin. We tell ourselves, "It was not very large sin, so why bother God with it? "Or perhaps we tell ourselves, "This sin is not so bad. After all, aren't we all sinners?" Or a person might say, "I could never admit and confess my sin to someone else. I would be too ashamed."

But the gospel message proclaims, "Repent!" Confession is the first step toward repentance. The Torah explicitly says, "Then he shall confess his sins which he has committed and repent" (Numbers 5:7). We must not passively accept the fact that we are sinners. We must strive against sin. Even the smallest sin should be confessed.
