If you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

Matthew 6:14

In decades past, it became popular to scoff at the idea we should forgive those who hurt us. Psychologists with impressive credentials wrote books trying to discredit the importance of forgiving our enemies. Now. Forgiveness is all the rage! Counselors of every stripe recommend it as the way to health, well-being, and peace. Of course, willingness to forgive others has always been one of Christianity's key teachings.

That doesn't mean forgiving others has always—or ever!—been easy. The difficulty posed by it may be one reason the New Testament so often repeats the admonition to forgive.

Forgiveness just doesn't come naturally. We'd rather keep score, tracking the offenses of others against us. Nursing a grudge can feel rather pleasant, at least for a wile. Eventually, though, grudges have a way of growing until, monster-like, the bitterness we've created devours us. Our Savior teaches us a better way:

For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you.

Almost always when scripture urges us to forgive, it reminds us in the same breath that our Lord has forgiven us. By forgiving others, we demonstrate that we have understood our need for God's forgiveness—and treasure it. God's forgiveness toward us nurtures and encourages within us the decision to forgive those around us.

Our Savior's goal for each of us is that we become more and more like him—
"little Christs," as some have put it. But he will not force that upon us. Maybe you had a well-meaning parent or first-grade teacher who pressured you and a friend with words

like these: "Say you're sorry!" "Now say you forgive her!"

Adults can force children to mumble words of confession and forgiveness, but God expects and instills more in his children. As we grow in grace, we come to recognize more and more fully the value of the pardon we have received from Jesus. Then, more and more willingly we pray, "Lord, work your heart of kindness in me and teach me to forgive."
