Way of God #2: God wants you to obey His instructions whether or hot they make sense to vou

God told Moses, "Put your hand inside your cloak" (Exodus 4:6) When Moses pulled his hand out, he had leprosy. Puzzled, Moses' eyebrows likely shot up. That certainly was not what he was expecting, but God expects us to obey Him even when we don't understand. Too often we say to God, "Tell me what You want me to accomplish, and I'll do it"—by which we usually mean, "Then I'll consider it." Obedience usually requires some knowledge, but complete comprehension is not a prerequisite to obedience, Our obeying God's commands is how He builds our faith in Him. If we knew the outcome before we obeyed God, it wouldn't be faith. God uses our obedience to move us into what He is doing.


